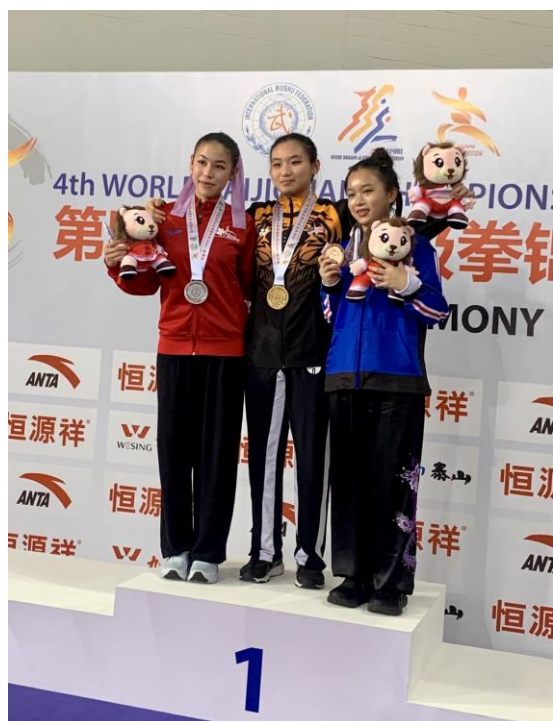


Ji Hong Athletes Shine on the Global Stage

In 2024, Ji Hong was proud to have students attend both the **4th World Taijiquan Championships** and the **9th World Junior Wushu Championships**, two global biennial events representing the pinnacle of competition.



The **4th World Taijiquan Championships** in Singapore attracted top Taijiquan athletes from 32 countries and regions across five continents. Team Canada's roster included 8 athletes competing in the Championship category and 6 in the Demonstration category. Of the 14 athletes gathered from all over Canada to represent the country, 80% were Ji Hong students from our Edmonton, Calgary, and Toronto campuses. Team Canada returned home with 5 medals, 3 of which were attained by Ji Hong students. From the Edmonton campus, Julianna Huang received 1 silver and 1 bronze, and Alex Fang received 1 bronze. In the Demonstration category, every Ji Hong member brought glory to Team Canada with a total of 3 certifications for the 2nd Prize and 10 certifications for the 3rd Prize.
